MS FAMILY CATECHESIS

There is something new at OLMCC for our Middle School families! We will be offering Family Catechesis for our Middle school families. What is Family Catechesis, and what is that going to look like at OLMCC? I'm glad you asked! The goal of Family Catechesis is to help families learn, pray, and discuss our faith in order to strengthen relationships and deepen our Catholic faith together.

For the Fall semester of 2018 we will be offering 3 sessions on the corporal works of mercy. The corporal works of mercy consist of feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead. We will have an engaging lesson on the work of mercy for that month and end with a meal together. During the month, I am hopeful that families will explore further the work of mercy together...ideas will be supplied on how to do this.

To be clear, this will take the place of the middle school meeting on Sundays after Mass.

Our first family session will be on September 30th at 5:30 in the classrooms downstairs. We will have a bit of an introduction to what "works of mercy" are, and talk about feeding the hungry.

Your Eminence:

I, and my parishioners, are deeply concerned about the sexual abuse crisis in the Church in America, particularly the Pennsylvania abuse report, but more importantly the cover-up of the Ted McCarrick situation. This is, perhaps, the greatest crisis to face the Church since the Reformation.

We are concerned that it appears that Pope Francis, the leadership of the USCCB, and the hierarchy of the Church in general do not understand the breadth and depth of our anger and disbelief. The picture of you, the Pope, and Archbishop Gomez laughing during your Rome meeting was an affront to the sensibilities of every concerned Catholic. It is beyond comprehension that McCarrick could live as a sexual predator without someone knowing about it. That he might have been secretly censured by Pope Benedict XVI and allowed to serve is beyond understanding.

On behalf of our parish, I beg you and the USCCB to take immediate and decisive action to investigate and correct these horrible situations. I beg you to understand that the Church, and especially our nation's bishops, have absolutely no moral credibility whatsoever. The only way to restore respect and trust is to act forcefully and quickly.

I offer these thoughts because I love the Catholic Church and want this matter resolved as quickly as possible.
