

# LIVING THE WORD

# Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 26, 2020

# REFLECTION

Notice the urgency in the disciples' response to Jesus' invitation. Peter, Andrew, James, and John were fishermen tending to their daily labor when a stranger appears on the shore and says, "Come, after me" (Matthew 4:19). The men immediately leave their nets and boats to follow Jesus. They do not stop to ask questions, nor do they offer any sort of explanation or excuse for why they are unable to follow. Rather, they accept the invitation and move forward in their relationship with the Lord.

Notice, also, where Jesus speaks to the first disciples. He does not invite them to a fancy dinner and offer an outlined business proposition. Instead, Jesus invites the first disciples in their ordinary places of work. The call itself was not extraordinary, nor was it elaborate or confusing. Jesus met the disciples where they were and simply said, "Come after me" (Mathew 4:19).

The same is true for us. Jesus does not necessarily call us in bombastic, grandiose ways. Jesus instead calls us amid our everyday routine. Jesus speaks to us in our studies and work, through our friends and families, and especially in the things that make us happy. We must recognize Jesus' call amid the ordinary events of our lives and respond without hesitation or excuses.

As you begin each day this week, ask God to help you be aware of his presence throughout your day, especially in the small, possibly unnoticed ways. At the end of the day, recall each of these encounters with God and offer a prayer of gratitude and thanksgiving.

God of goodness,
help us to trust you,
listen to your guidance,
and to thank you for the gifts you
have bestowed upon us.
May we be always faithful to you.
Through Christ our Lord.
Amen.
