## LIVING THE WORD

### Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 3, 2019



#### REFLECTION

Do you know your vocation in life? These three powerful readings point to vocation as a follower of Jesus. Born in God's image, Jeremiah tells us that we were formed to be "a prophet to the nations" (Jeremiah 1:5). Then Paul's letter to the Corinthians furthers this calling by reminding us to love. A popular reading for the Sacrament of Matrimony, couples pray this passage in earnest as they embark on their journey. Knowing that following Jesus and living out Marriage vows can be so tough, we are reminded that "love never fails" (1 Corinthians 13:8). The only way love fails is through our free will. Luke goes on to tell us that as we live our vocation to love, it is likely that we will be rejected and challenged in many ways on our journey. In fact, we could be thrown out of town as they tried to do to Jesus! Imagine how teenagers might experience this if they feel called to the priesthood or to serve as a deacon or sister. As a teen, to stand up for your faith in light of societal pressures can feel like social suicide. We must support those discerning this holy vocation which is so necessary to the future of our faith.



#### ACTION

Look up your diocesan vocation website. Search around on this website and reflect on your own vocation. Pope Francis encourages those who feel inclined toward the religious life in these words: "Becoming a priest or a man or woman religious is not primarily our own decision. . . . Rather it is the response to a call and to a call of love" (Pope Francis, Address to Seminarians and Novices, given July 6, 2013). Consider contacting the vocations director in your archdiocese to see how you can support teens called to religious life. Who knows, it may be a start on your journey to find your own vocation.
