

Volunteers Needed for New Ministry

Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of the Mount:

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tells us that the corporal works of mercy are feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, sheltering the homeless, and burying the dead (CCC 2447). We are one of only three parishes in the entire Archdiocese of Atlanta with a Memorial Garden in which the ashes of our beloved parishioners and others are inurned into the earth on our own hallowed grounds. There are many parishes with columbaria for the inurnment of the ashes of the deceased. These, of course, do not require gravediggers. We, however, do have a need for gravediggers. We would like to develop an interment ministry. Ideally, we will have at least two teams of three or four people per team. Upon notification of an upcoming burial in the Memorial Garden, the designated team would go into action to set up a tent covering and dig, according to required specifications, the grave for the ashes of the deceased. If you believe that you may have a call to take on this solemn responsibility, please pray on it. The ministry is open to all who are physically able and willing to handle a shovel. See Father Mark or Mark Voges if interested. You may also call the church office. And thanks to all of you who through your labor and/or financial assistance are helping OLMCC in serving those in need of the other corporal works of mercy.


