Dear Parishioners,

Starting with the weekend Masses April 22-23, we will offer Holy Communion in both species, that is you will have the option to receive the Precious Blood in addition to the consecrated host. The Church has always held that in the Eucharistic host one receives during the Communion Rite is the fullness of Christ's Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Therefore, it is not necessary to receive the cup containing the Precious Blood. However, for those of you who want to drink from the cup, you will now have that option again. There is a list in the narthex for you to sign up if you are interested in serving as an Extraordinary of Holy Minister Communion (EMHC). Please check the appropriate box on the form to let me know if you are an experienced EMHC or if you want to become one for the first time. By signing this list you are committing yourself to being available at any Holy Day of Obligation, Vigil or Sunday Mass at which you are present. There will be a mandatory training session for all experienced and inexperienced EMHCs. Three sessions will be offered at OLMCC: Thursday, April 13 at 7:00 P.M., Saturday, April 15 at 11:00 A.M., and Saturday, April 22 at 1:00 P.M. Everyone must attend at least one of the three training sessions to be an EMHC. The training session at SKD will be on April 16 following the 11:30 A.M. Mass.
