

Interview Excerpt #1

Before Fr. Mark's installation as our pastor on June 25, he sat down with Michelle Coakley to share a few details we might not know about his life's journey before arriving on Lookout Mountain.

Q. Tell me about your family.

A. I'm the oldest of four children (2 brothers and a sister), but my mother (Parishioner Mary Thomas) has 12 siblings and I have more than 50 first cousins. So while I've never been married, I have been part of and observed large family life all my life.

Q. What did you learn being part of a large family?

A. You're not the most important person in the world. You don't necessarily get everything you want. Parish families are a lot like big extended families. The give and take of being part of a family is a lot like the give and take of being part of a parish. Every member has his or her own way of thinking, which may or may not match yours. But the common factor is always love and concern for each other's well-being.

Q. Did you play sports growing up?

A. Oh yes. Baseball, tennis, neighborhood tackle football, basketball and running. Youth sports helped me become the man I am. Sports taught me discipline and that it's not all about you, but the team as a whole. I was a bench warmer on the high school basketball team. I was a very good shooter, but I didn't have quick enough feet. So I contributed to the team as a long range shooter that the starting team had to defend against. I once made 38 consecutive free throws in a JV practice and enjoyed practices more than games. I learned you don't have to be the best player on the team to be important. You can support your team by showing up to practice and making your teammates better. Then I became a distance runner and completed 9 marathons.

Q. Wow, 9 marathons? What was your fastest time?

A. 2 hours, 42 minutes and 9 seconds just shy of my 28th birthday in the November 1989 Marine Corps Marathon in Washington DC. (MC note: that's an impressive pace of just over 6 minutes per mile – for 26.2 miles!) Then I ran a 2:46 in January 1990 at the Houston Marathon. I also ran the NYC marathon in 1990 and the Boston Marathon in 1992.

Q. What is your favorite sports team?

A. (No hesitation) The Atlanta Braves. I saw their final game to win the 1995 world series with a date. But I liked them even when they weren't winning. Sports teaches you to stick with your team through the wins and the losses.
