These troublesome times can be a time of joy and renewal. As we are now in the throes of what has become more than six months of pandemic, with all of the restrictions and uncertainties that that entails--social unrest like we have not seen in decades, and now a contentious national election on the horizon. We may be tempted to throw our hands up and say, "Lord, help us." It is fine to beseech the Lord to help us. It is fitting that we turn to God for relief from the things that ail the world. As Christians we are called as individuals, as families, as chaste single men and women, to show our joy to the world. Paul's words to the Philippians in our second reading this Sunday remind us of the necessity of humility: "Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others." (Phil 2:3-4) A well known football player from my youth, Gayle Sayers (Chicago Bears), passed this week. His autobiography is entitled I Am Third. God is first, others are second, and Gayle Sayers, who lived his book's title as he cared for and walked with his teammate and friend, Brian Piccolo, as Piccolo fought the cancer that took his life at 26: Gayle Sayers was third. We all know that in the Scriptures God tells Moses to tell the Israelites that He (God) is I AM. Let us remember to humble ourselves by adding that crucial word "third" whenever we consider ourselves. Oh, by the way, Piccolo and Sayers, were both the same race: human.
