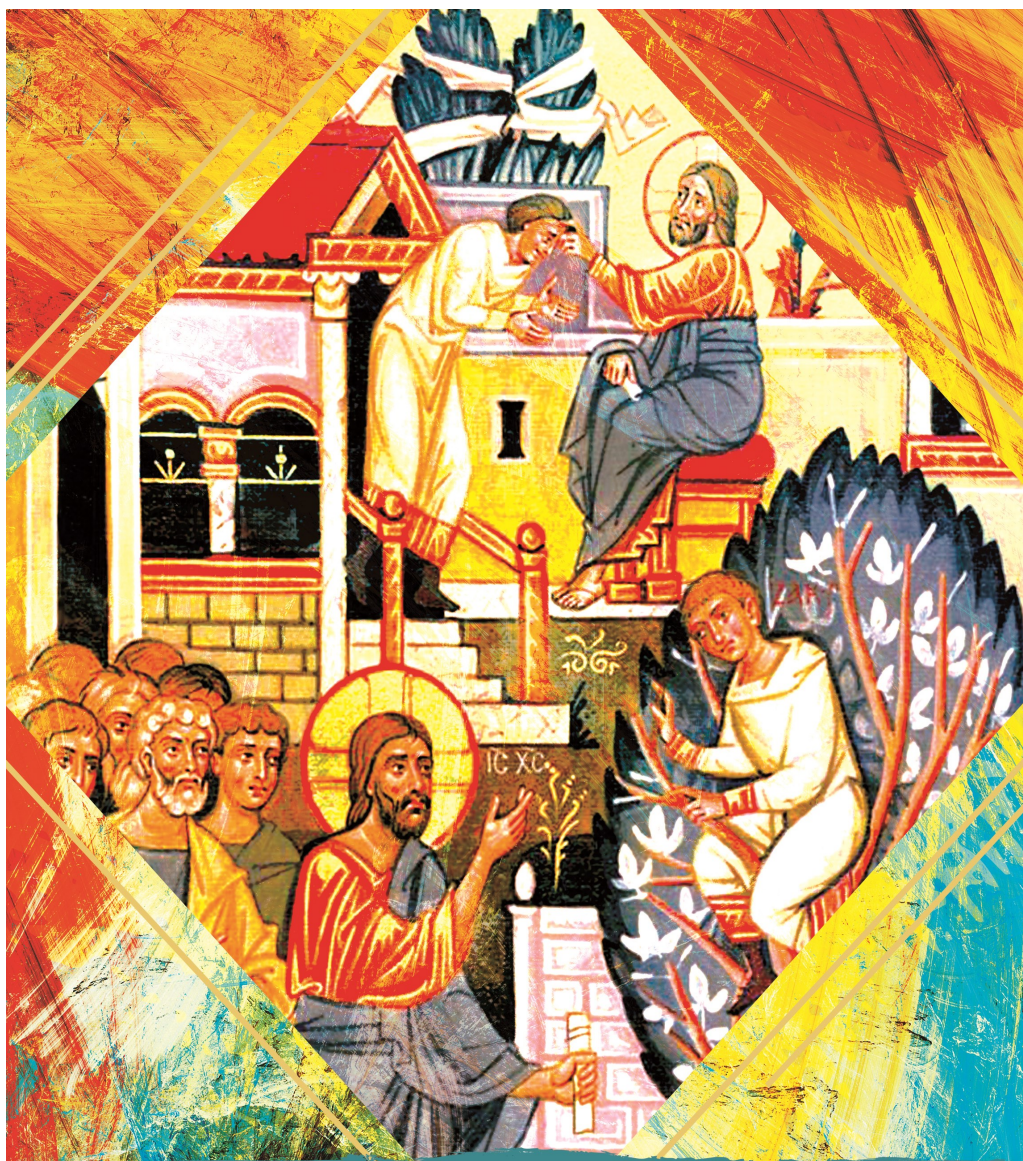

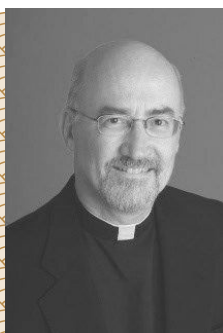
A Retreat Day for Our Lady of the Mount



We are only just beginning to emerge from an as yet unfinished global pandemic.

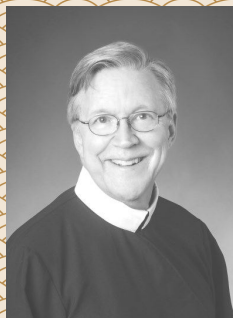
At this time, many fear that 'this is the way it will always be.' But our spiritual lives and experience of God were never meant to be a repeat of what has gone before.
