

In spite of the economy the good news is we can be thankful people are slowly returning to church and regular giving has increased in recent months, but it is still not at pre-pandemic levels, meaning our monthly operating costs are not being covered on a continuous basis.

We are all proud of Shuler Hall, completed just a few months before the Pandemic with a bridge loan from the Archdiocese. We have nearly fully paid back the bridge loan to the Archdiocese having only a balance as of October of \$172,856 (originally \$2,700,000). Adding the building's remaining debt, approximately \$165,000 for the new, and much needed HVAC system in the 38 year old building, we find ourselves with total debt of **\$ 362,415 as** of October 31. Good progress on debt reduction has occurred this year and we are grateful to everyone who helped.

Now, with year end approaching, we ask that you prayerfully consider <u>a tax deductible gift, over and</u> <u>above normal giving to help reduce the debt.</u> Any gift now and before June 30, 2023 is assessment <u>free which effectively is a bonus of as much as 10 % to the church's bottom line.</u>

- Appreciated stock can be gifted directly avoiding your paying capital gains but still taking the full value of the deduction.
- If you are over 70 ½ years old, you can give any portion of your required minimum distribution straight to the church with no tax hit.
- Both of these actions take someone with knowledge of <u>your</u> tax situation, <u>and</u> following the prescribed process but are excellent ways you can help your church and quite possibly reducing your income tax liability.
