Hot Meals Ministry

Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of the Mount and St. Katharine Drexel:

This month marks the two-year anniversary of Hot Meals Ministry. Through your generous contributions of time, treasure and talent, hot meals have been consistently provided on Monday afternoons to anywhere from 25 to over 35 people in the Chattanooga area who are either residing outdoors in tent communities or who are temporarily housed in local motels. We are reminded through this and our other ministries that one day the Lord will call us to account as individuals, as a parish church, as a nation. Matthew 25:35 says, "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me." This is our Christian mandate: to serve and expect nothing in return; to be lights of Christ in the world. Through Hot Meals and our outreach to A Hand UP Ministry of Dade County, as well as the support we provide to the teachers and students of Orchard Knob Middle School, we live MT 25:35. We are also expanding our footprint at Walker State Prison through providing mentor friends to Catholic inmates, whom are visited a couple of times each month, and to whom we offer a Mass on the last Sunday of each month. Let us continue this year and beyond to offer as we can, according to our state in life, the time, the talent and the treasure of everyone at OLM and St. Katharine. Together, we can continue to produce good fruit in the vineyard of the Lord. Together we can accomplish so much!

CHURCH REGULATIONS FOR LENT

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and is a day of universal fasting and abstinence. The following church regulations are observed throughout the season of Lent:

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays during Lent by Catholics of 14 years of age and older.

All Catholics who are at least 18 years of age but no yet 59 years of age observe fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those bound by this rule may eat only one full meal.

Two smaller meals (that all together are not equal to a full meal) are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to personal needs, but eating solid foods between meals are not permitted.

Those who are sick, pregnant, nursing, or with a compromised health that would be adversely affected by fasting or abstinence should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

During the season of Lent, we are all called to embrace penance and perform works of charity and mercy that reflect our desire of a true conversion of heart. May this holy season of Lent 2023 lead all of us to a deeper union with Christ and with one another.
